Legislature in Lincoln.

It is also a year of transition. This fall, our Executive Director, Laurel Marsh, announced her retirement after five years of dedicated service. Our Search Committee knows there are a number of highly qualified individuals who will make excellent leaders for ACLU. Many of them are not looking for a new job and may not run across our job announcement. Fast and furious is the best way to describe the 2010-2011 year. ACLU Nebraska celebrated its 45th anniversary as our national ACLU turned 90! Nebraska action centered on immigration, reproductive freedom, and proselytizing in public schools.

When the City of Fremont passed an intimidating and unconstitutional ordinance that attempts to drive out undocumented immigrants and their families by punishing those who employ them or rent to them, ACLU Nebraska filed suit. This suit, *Martinez v. Fremont*, drew national attention. Rock musician

Conor Oberst threw a benefit concert in Omaha and generously gave us \$50,000 to fund this effort. The suit is still in progress.

Few decisions are more personal than the decision whether or not to bear a child. Several Supreme Court cases guarantee to a woman's reproductive rights. A woman


may elect an abortion prior to the viability of the fetus if this is the decision that she and her doctor decide is necessary for her. In spite of this, Nebraska's Legislature passed two restrictive bills, LB 594 and LB 1103. LB 594, the so-called *Women's Health Protection Act*, was found to be unconstitutional and was permanently enjoined. LB 1103, which bans abortions after 20 weeks and ignores the viability standard, is still in force. Nebraska's women face further unconstitutional restrictions of their reproductive freedoms if those of moderate opinion fail to let

state senators know.

At the beginning of the last school year, ACLU Nebraska sent a letter to all public school superintendents in Nebraska reminding them that speakers at required school convocations could not deliver religious messages to captive audiences of children. The First Amendment does not allow the school, as a public institution, to endorse one religious viewpoint over others. To make a better point of our First Amendment freedoms, ACLU Nebraska held its second PSA contest. A team of students from Johnson-Brock High School won first place.

ACLU Nebraska works to preserve the civil liberties guaranteed to us all by the US and Nebraska constitutions through programs of education, litigation and legislation. The work we did last year, described in this annual report, puts us in a position to do our current work, described in the Fall *Defender's Debrief*.
